

Greg Brown selected to represent all disabled officers at  
National Memorial ceremony.

Greg Brown, retired Rocky Mount police officer, was selected for the great honor of representing all disabled officers in the nation at a ceremony May 15 in Washington, DC at the National Memorial. After the 192 survivors of deceased officers placed carnations in a memorial wreath, Brown placed the lone carnation in the wreath for all disabled officers. Brown is pictured at the ceremony in his RMPD uniform.

Greg Brown was shot in the line of duty in 2005 during a disturbance call in Rocky Mount. His injuries rendered him disabled, and he had to retire at age 32. He is happy to be alive and spends a lot of time with his wife Shannon and his two small children – Alston, age seven and Paige, age four.

Greg stays very busy with the NC Fraternal Order of Police. He is the local lodge (Rocky Mount Lodge #46) State Trustee, and he also serves on two state committees: the Disaster Assistance Response Team (DART) and the State Recruitment Committee.

Greg continues to serve our profession diligently. We can never forget him and his family's sacrifice.
